Lenora Reed teaches people how to breathe.

To most people, this would seem to come naturally. But for those who suffer from chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, nothing comes easily.

Lenora teaches a five-week course to people who have conditions like emphysema, chronic bronchitis and asthma. Because breathing is basic, patients are taught everything from anatomy and physiology to how to climb a flight of stairs without becoming short of breath and how to use their medications properly.

After completing the course, patients can attend a monthly support group called "Better Breathers." The most satisfying aspect of Lenora's job is giving her patients tools they can use to improve their quality of life.

Lenora recalls two patients who were finally able to travel after completing the course — something they had not been able to do before. "Their lung disease had been a millstone, the trips were milestones."


